The *Texas Speech Communication Journal* issues a call for papers that focus on Cultural Studies in Communication. Contributors may approach the topic from a variety of methodological perspectives. Manuscripts should be received no later than **April 10, 2015**. Manuscripts not devoted to the topic of Cultural Studies in Communication will be considered for the research section of the issue as space allows. TSCJ follows a policy of blind review so no author identification should appear in the body of the manuscript.

Manuscripts should not exceed 25 pages and be written according to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (6th edition)*. The title page should include the author's name, academic position, institutional affiliation, full mailing address, telephone number, email address, brief author bio, and a history of the manuscript (presentation at conferences). An abstract of not more than 150 words should accompany the manuscript. The author should also include keywords for the article. Email submissions are preferred for both manuscripts and teaching tips (either in WordPerfect or Word).

John Poch has an M.F.A. in Poetry from the University of Florida and a Ph.D. in English from the University of North Texas. He was the Colgate University Creative Writing Fellow from 2000-2001, and now is Professor of English in the creative writing program at Texas Tech University.

His most recent collection, *Fix Quiet*, won the New Criterion Poetry Prize and will be published in December 2014. *Dolls*, a collection of poems, was released in September 2009. Two Men Fighting with a Knife (Story Line Press 2008) won the Donald Justice Award. His first book, *Poems*, was published in January 2004 was a finalist for the PEN/Osterweil prize. *The Essential Hockey Haiku* (a poetry/fiction collaboration with Chad Davidson) was published in Fall 2006.

Poch was a recipient of the "Discovery"/*The Nation* Prize in 1998 and has been awarded residencies at the MacDowell Colony, Headlands Center for the Arts, The Saltonstall Foundation, and Blue Mountain Center. For ten years, he was the editor of the award-winning *32 Poems Magazine*. He is a co-editor of the poetry anthology: *Old Flame: From the First Ten Years of 32 Poems Magazine*.

Linda Wickersham is chair of the English department at Lubbock High School and teaches English III and IV IB. She graduated from Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls with a bachelor's degree in education and a minor in English. Wickersham's plan was to teach only until her writing career took off.

But after discovering her love for teaching, her writing took a back seat. Only after interviewing her husband's grandmother did she begin to focus on writing again. This woman's life provided the inspiration for her first novel, *The Weaving of a Woman*, which was published in 2004.

The Theory of Three, her second novel, was also published in 2004. She is currently working on a third novel. Writing and publishing has added another element to her classroom as she uses her experience to help her students learn to be better writers.
