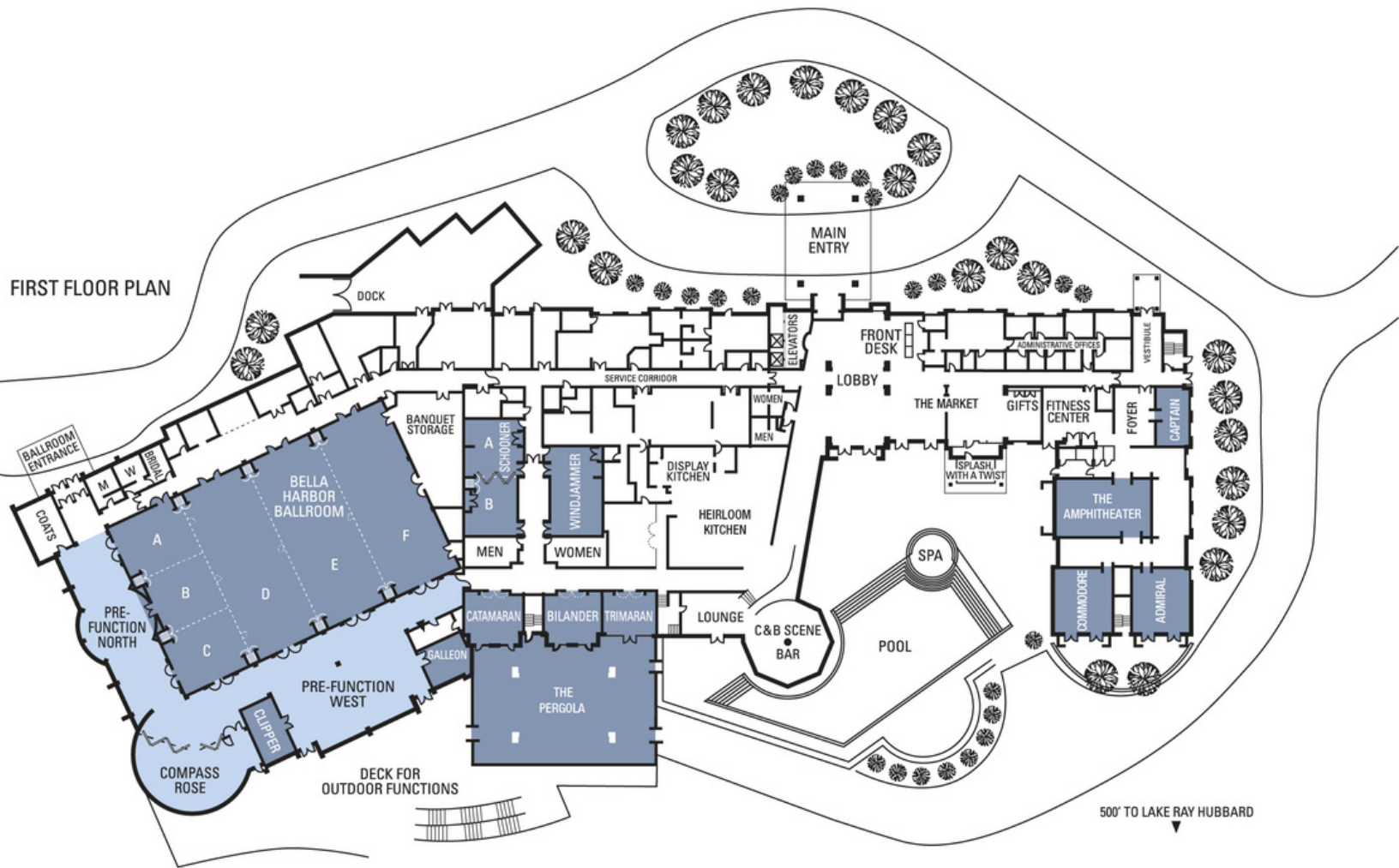

Call for Manuscripts

The Texas Speech Communication Journal (TSCJ) issues a call for papers that focus on research in human communication. Contributors may approach topics from multiple perspectives, contexts, and methodologies supported within the discipline. Manuscripts that emphasize discovery, legibility, comity, or topics of special relevance to Texas are encouraged. Submissions should be received no later than December 20, 2026. TSCJ follows a policy of blind review so no author identification should appear in the abstract and body of the manuscript. For volume 51, TSCJ welcomes three types of submissions for consideration:

1. Original Scholarship
2. Book Reviews
3. Forum: Lone Star Elections 2026

Original Scholarship

Manuscripts should not exceed 9,000 words, including references and figures, and should be written according to the most recent edition of either the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association or Chicago Manual of Style. All submissions should be divided into the following two (Microsoft Word) documents:

1. Title Page should include: author name(s), academic position(s), institutional affiliation(s), mailing address(es), email(s), author bio(s) - under 50 words each, method/approach (e.g. rhetorical criticism/theory, qualitative/quantitative methods, content/multimodal analysis, ethnography or field methods, etc.), 2-5 keywords, and brief history of the manuscript (any conferences, campus, or other presentations, etc.).
2. Anonymized Abstract and Manuscript - An abstract of no more than 150 words and 2-5 keywords should accompany the manuscript. No author identification should appear in this file. Incomplete manuscripts will be desk rejected. Include all tables, graphs, and appendices.

Book Reviews

Texas Speech Communication Journal invites book reviews of academic monographs and edited volumes in the field of Communication Studies. Quality reviews should do the following:

- Quickly and creatively convey the content, claims, and significance of the book.
- Mention the author(s) and how the book fits into their larger body of work.
- Provide a summary of the book structure and organization.
- Highlight the book's major themes and scholarly interventions.
- Include careful criticism of ways in which the book might have been stronger in the reviewer assessment.

Book review submissions should be no more than 1,600 words in length and conform to Chicago Style guidelines. The journal is willing to coordinate with prospective reviewers to assist in securing a review copy of the book furnished by the academic publisher. Prospective reviewers are welcome to email the TSCJ editor to pitch potential books to review prior to submission.

Forum: Lone Star Elections 2026

TSCJ requests submissions for a special forum of short entries addressing the communication dimensions of the 2026 midterm elections in Texas. Given the salience of the 2026 midterm election cycle in Texas, including U.S. House redistricting, new candidates and retirements, the party primary defeat of multiple incumbent members of Congress, and numerous marquee races heading into November, a special forum on communication in Lone Star elections is warranted.

Interested contributors should submit a 500-word abstract of their idea via the TSCJ submission portal online and are welcome to direct any inquiries to Dr. Randall Fowler (rpf23a@acu.edu), TSCJ editor, and Dr. Gil Carter (tgcl33@msstate.edu), guest editor for this forum.

The Texas Speech Communication Journal is a state journal published by the Texas Speech Communication Association. TSCJ normally publishes one print issue annually. The journal has a 24% acceptance rate.

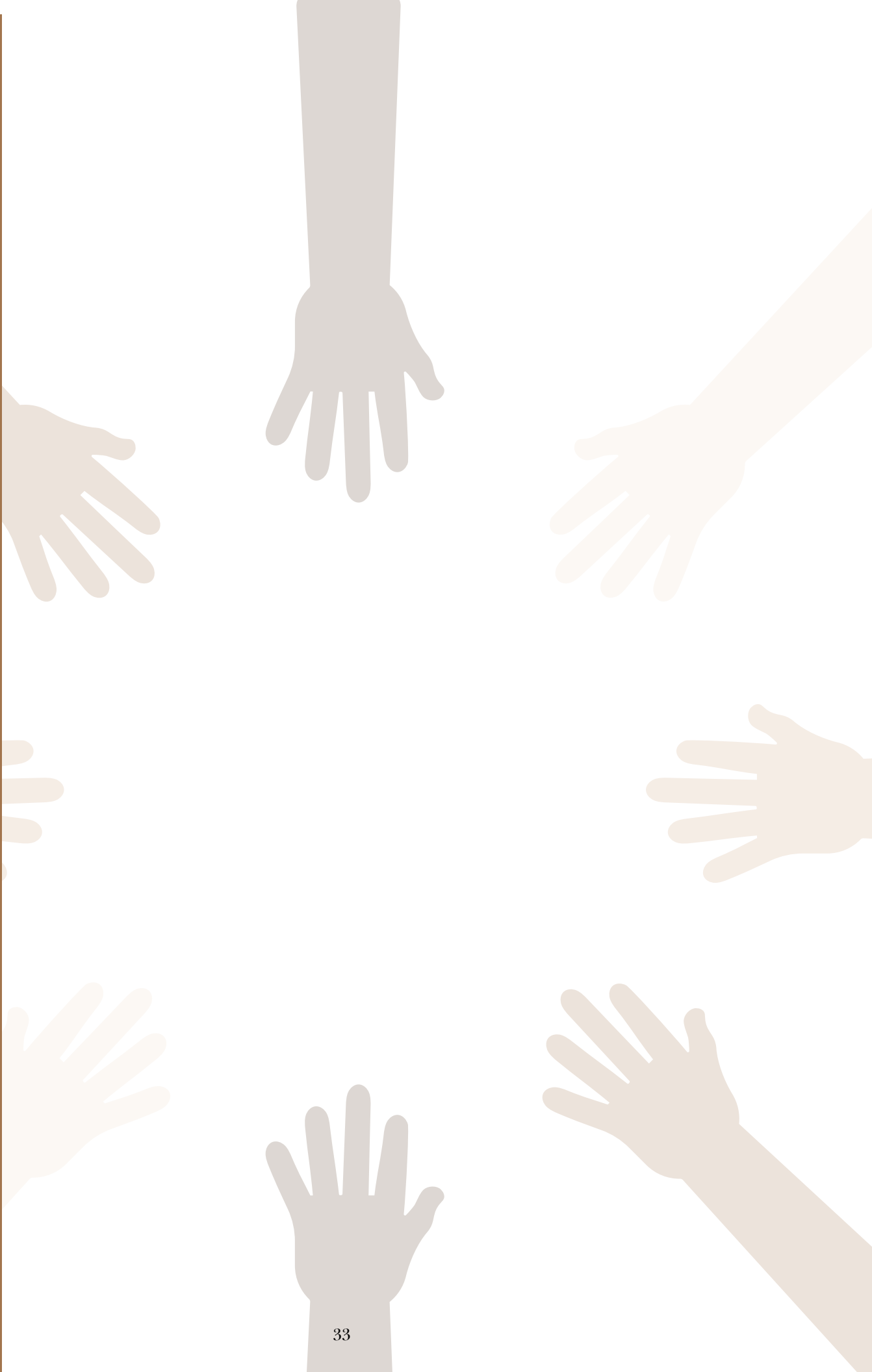

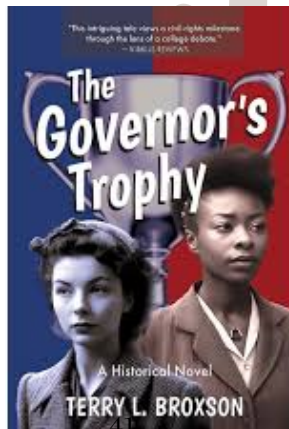
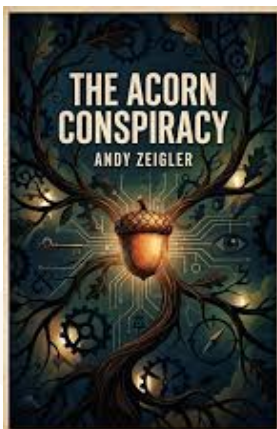
